Branch partnership to support carers

The Gravesend & District branch has built a budding relationship with Carers First in Kent.

Following the closure of the North West Kent Carers, as well as the loss of a specialist local counsellor for MS Carers in the area, a gap in support was felt in the Gravesend & District area.

When Carers First stepped into the gap, the branch decided to strengthen their relationship with the new organisation and worked with them to arrange a special drop-in session for local families and carers in November.

Karen Jackson, a Carer Support and Assessment Coordinator from Carers First provided carers in the area with specialist benefits advice, which the branch is unable to provide. The local MS nurse also droppedin and got an overview of the services they offer. On the day, five new carers registered with Carers First, which will ensure they are provided with ongoing support. The event marked the beginning of a strong relationship that will see Carers First attending branch drop-in sessions on a monthly basis, and the local MS nurse signposting carers to the information and support they can provide.

The latest news on the four new MS medicines

Four new MS medicines, which have proved safe and effective in late stage clinical trials for relapsing remitting MS, are being considered by the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) for use on the NHS across England and Wales.

We're pleased to report that NICE's final decision on teriflunomide is that they intend to make it available on the NHS in England and Wales. As we go to print this decision is undergoing a standard appeal process, which is routine before a treatment is made available following a positive decision. This treatment is still going through the Scottish Medicines Consortium process at the moment.

We're still waiting for the initial NICE decision on dimethyl fumurate and will be responding to an initial disappointing negative decision for alemtuzumab. The fourth medicine, laquinimod, is at a much earlier stage in the process, with the first appraisal committee scheduled for May 2014.

Treatments should be available in England and Wales within three months of NICE issuing final guidance, which follows the appeal process after the final decision; and a little later in Northern Ireland. Scotland has a separate process, but is working to a similar timescale. Keep an eye on our website for updates at http://www.mssociety.org.uk/ms-news.

Personal Independence Payment

The rollout of the new benefit Personal Independence Payment began this year, and we're really keen to hear about your experiences of the assessment for the new benefit. This will allow us to report any problems back to the government as quickly as possible, and crucially, call for change.

We've designed a survey covering the different stages of the PIP application process and are working on it with other members of the Disability Benefits Consortium. This means that the evidence we gather will be from a wide range of people and will give us the clearest picture of how PIP is working, and any problems that need to be addressed.

Branch planning for 2014

The New Year is here, and it's time to start reviewing your fundraising activities from 2013 and plan for the year ahead. We recommend you start a fundraising plan to help you throughout 2014.

What's a fundraising plan?

A fundraising plan is a straightforward document to show how much money you need (or want) to raise for your branch and how you are going to raise it. A plan will give you a good idea of how much you need to raise to deliver the services you want as well as the activities that will help you meet your fundraising target.

Fundraising self-assessment

As part of your planning, it's a good idea to use the fundraising self-assessment tool. You can identify your branch or group's strengths and areas for improvement.

The self-assessment tool is available on the volunteer website under the Fundraising and Campaigning section titled "Effective fundraising".

Your area fundraiser can help you develop your fundraising activities, and with such a diverse range of fundraising events there's always at least one new event you could try!

Online fundraising

Collecting sponsorship online is an increasingly popular way that supporters are choosing to fundraise given its ease and convenience.

JustGiving, our preferred supplier, also collect Gift Aid automatically on our behalf.

We don't recommend using other sites, as they don't always safeguard funds exclusively for the charity chosen by the supporter (an issue experienced after the liquidation of The Dove Trust's Charity Giving site in the summer) or provide full reporting mechanisms. Additionally processing donations from multiple sites incurs additional expense as its more time consuming to reconcile income.

Selling MS Society vehicles

We've been in discussions with HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) over VAT arrangements for our branches. One area highlighted by HMRC has been the sale of motor vehicles and VAT. This is a complex area so if you have any questions on this information, please speak to the finance team.

Approval

If you want to sell branch land, property or motor vehicles you will need to contact the MSNC finance department in order to get approval.

Selling motor vehicles and VAT

You may need to charge VAT when selling a motor vehicle – it will all depend on:

- what type of vehicle it is
- whether you were charged VAT when you purchased the vehicle
- who you sold the vehicle to

The rules are:

- 1. If you sell a vehicle to another branch VAT is not applicable in this case.
- 2. You are selling a wheelchair accessible vehicle where you didn't have to pay VAT to purchase it because it met the rules contained in the Treasurers Handbook Appendix E, Annex F You do not have to charge VAT if you are selling the vehicle to another charity or organisation that meets the requirements

for not charging VAT (see the VAT certificate contained in the Treasurers Handbook Appendix E, Annex F).

If you are selling the vehicle to anyone else you will need to charge VAT.

3. You are selling a vehicle where VAT was not charged and it did not meet the rules contained in the Treasurers Handbook Appendix E, Annex F

You do not have to charge VAT providing you sold the vehicle for less than what you paid for it. If you sold it for more then please speak to the finance team at the MS National Centre as the rules in this case are very complicated.

4. A vehicle where you had to pay VAT to purchase it

You do not need to charge VAT on the sale of the vehicle.

Raising a VAT invoice

If you do have to charge VAT then a VAT invoice will need to be raised. Only the finance team can raise VAT invoices so please get in touch.

What to do with the VAT you receive

The VAT you receive will need to be passed on to the MSNC so it can be included on our VAT return. Please pass this over promptly so we can process this efficiently.

Branch pro-formas

The deadline to submit branch pro-formas is 31 January 2014. There are different processes this year for branches who are, and aren't, using the online branch accounting systems.

Branches using online branch accounting

If your branch uses online branch accounting, your treasurer should have received an update of the treasurers' handbook and the internal financial controls checklist via email.

What you need to do:

- the chair must verify the receipts and payments report column figure for 'year to date' to December 2013. This can either be done by emailing back a copy of the report to the finance team (copying in the branch treasurer) confirming it's accurate, or, signing the report and posting it back to finance
- the chair and treasurer must both sign the completed internal financial controls checklist and return these to the finance team by email or post
- these must both be completed by 31 January 2014

Branches not using online branch accounting

If your branch doesn't use online branch accounting your branch treasurer should have received a paper copy branch pro-forma pack for 2013 via post. If you haven't received your pro-forma or would like an electronic copy, please contact us on the details below.

What you need to do:

- the branch chair and treasurer need to sign the completed internal financial controls checklist and post it to the finance team at the address below
- This must be completed by 31 January 2014

Please remember, you don't need branch annual meeting approval to send the accounts direct to MS National Centre. In addition, if you're waiting on a report from an accountant or for your balance sheet to be signed, please send a draft copy of your pro forma separately before the end of January and provide a copy of the report or signed balance sheet as soon as it's available.

Exercise classes – 2014 schedule

The New Year is traditionally a time to set challenges, so why not be more active with our exercise classes?

Research suggests that regular exercise can help people with MS alleviate their symptoms, including fatigue, and manage their condition more effectively. It can also help people with MS stay as mobile and active as possible. This is because it improves muscle strength and fitness, which can help with mobility and weakness problems. There's no evidence that exercise makes MS worse in the long-term or that it causes relapses.

The classes, run in conjunction with Active Communities, focus on functional exercises designed to improve posture, mobility and strength, and cater for all levels of mobility.
