## Volunteer Role Description

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All our activities and services are shaped by our MS community – people affected by MS, volunteers, staff and other experts. We involve our community in every level of shaping our work – from consultation and engagement, to decision-making and insight groups. That’s how we make sure we meet the needs of our whole community and that what we do works for everyone.

As our Co-production Champion, you’ll raise awareness of involvement and co-production within the MS community. You’ll:

- represent our MS community
- engage with and influence decision makers
- inspire people to get involved by delivering presentations at events
- and make sure our community’s voice is heard.

In this role you’ll be able to develop your networking, influencing, communication and presentation skills.

Most importantly you’ll inspire new people to work with us to help everyone with MS live their life to the full.

### What the role involves

This role may vary depending on needs and is likely to include:

- Ensuring the voice of people affected by MS is heard and representing the MS community
- Representing our brand and aims
- Promoting opportunities for our MS community to take part in co-production by speaking at events
- Sharing on social media what you’re up to in your volunteer role
- Helping co-deliver workshops and talks to inspire our community to get involved in co-production
- Celebrate the benefits and impact of co-production by sharing stories e.g. through blogs and videos
- Up to date knowledge of MS, our activities and issues faced by people affected by MS

### Essential

- Committed to our values
- Interested in our work and the issues faced by people affected by MS
- Able to make contacts
- Listening skills
- Able to communicate clear messages e.g. verbally or written
- Confident using Microsoft Office, the internet and email
- Able to apply disability, equality and inclusion practices
- Able to keep people's personal data safe

### Desirable

- Able to effectively challenge decision makers and/or culture to change
- Specific understanding and knowledge about the structures we are influencing, e.g. health care system, local government, public relations, social media
- Effective presentation skills
- Confident to speak up, referring to personal experience where appropriate

- Read through your welcome and induction checklist and follow-up the actions and guidance within it
