Volunteer role description

We're the MS Society – a community of people living with MS, volunteers, scientists, campaigners, listeners, organisers, ambassadors and fundraisers. Join us today so that together we can stop MS.

Would you like to help us support people by sharing stories about MS and bringing people together? As our Communications Volunteer you'll be at the heart of talking to our different MS communities and helping them feel part of something bigger. You'll write and edit newsletters, respond to information requests, and help develop engaging content for social media.

In this role you'll be able to develop your writing skills, and gain experience of communicating across a range of digital channels.

Most importantly you'll be helping us engage with lots of people and get the word out to people with MS about support to help them live their lives to the full.

What the role involves

The specific tasks of this role are likely to include:

- Helping update information resources
- Supporting with developing and editing stories about MS from our community
- Writing and editing newsletters, eBulletins and promotional materials
- Supporting content development for our MS communities, for example, helping us gather photos and stories
- Helping moderate social media channels
- Using MS Society systems, like our content management system (CMS), where relevant

You can carry out this role from home or one of our national offices, depending on where the role is based. We will support you in remote volunteering and in developing the skills you need for this role, including an induction into all the areas outlined. You will have a chance to discuss your role, claiming expenses and any additional needs with us.

What you need for this role

Essential

- Confident using Microsoft Office, the internet and email
- Confident communicator in written and spoken English
- Prepared to follow our disability, equality and inclusion practices and to keep people's personal data safe
- Committed to our values
- Enjoy writing and happy to follow our brand guidelines and tone of voice

Desirable

- Good research skills and able to motivate and support contributions from others
- Happy to build relationships with new and existing external organisations
- Willing to develop skills and experience
- Willing to learn bespoke IT systems
